

Dress Code

Campus dress codes are established to teach grooming and hygiene, prevent disruption, and minimize safety hazards. Students and parents may determine a student's personal dress and grooming standards, provided they comply with the following:

ITEM	ACCEPTABLE DRESS	SPECIAL COMMENTS AND INTERPRETATIONS
Shirts, Blouses	Shirts/blouses may be: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● Any collared shirt/blouse ● T-shirts and other pull-over tops ● Sweatshirts/sweaters ● School designs/logos; brand names and/or other appropriate words are acceptable. 	Students are prohibited from wearing shirts/blouses that: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● Are oversized or immodestly undersized. Boys- shirts must have sleeves. Muscle shirts and tank tops, mesh knit shirts, or extra-thin clothing are not acceptable. Girls-Midriffs, crop tops, tank tops, camisole, strapless garments, low-cut tops are not permitted. ● Depict or reference alcohol, drugs, tobacco, weapons, nudity, death, violence, vulgar or obscene language or images, and/or insults to race, religion, gender, gang affiliation, gang colors, or like dress are not permitted.
Pants, Slacks	Acceptable pants/slacks are worn at the waist, belted, if appropriate, and not "baggy". Tights, leggings, jeggings, spandex yoga pants, or other form fitting materials may be worn as long as the shortest point of the shirt/dress covering them is a minimum of mid-thigh length when standing. No holes or tears above mid-thigh are acceptable unless worn over leggings or tights.	Pants/slacks may not be: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● Touching the ground or covering the foot ● Baggy or oversized, low rider pants, or sagging inseams allowed. Foundation garments should not be exposed (i.e. shorts, underwear, boxers, etc). ● Pajamas ● Made of inappropriately form-fitting materials ● No thin material pants where undergarments are visible.
Shorts	Acceptable shorts are no shorter than mid-thigh for all grades.	Shorts may not be: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● Made of inappropriate form-fitting materials ● Baggy or oversized ● Boxers or pajamas ● No thin material shorts where undergarments are visible Must meet the acceptable length requirement regardless of whether leggings are also worn.
Dresses, Skorts, Skirts	Dresses/skorts/skirts are: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● Worn at waist (skirts/skorts) ● No shorter than mid-thigh for all grades. 	Dresses/skorts/skirts may not be: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● of revealing form-fitting materials. ● Slits in skirts or dresses must be modest. Must meet the acceptable length requirement regardless of whether leggings are also worn.
Shoes	Shoes must be: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● Worn at all times ● Chosen for safety and health reasons Athletic shoes with a rubber sole, closed toes, and a full support around the heel should be worn for PE	Houseshoes and shoes with wheels are not acceptable.

Hair	<p>Hair must be clean, well-groomed and out of the eyes, and shall be a non-distracting hair color that is styled in a way that is neither distracting nor conspicuous.</p> <p>Facial hair such as mustaches, beards, goatees, or sideburns below the earlobes must be neat in appearance.</p>	<p>Facial hair must be clean and well groomed and styled in a way that is neither distracting nor conspicuous.</p> <p>Hairstyles that create a safety hazard or a material or substantial disruption are not permitted.</p>
Jewelry	<p>Pierced jewelry, (including spaces) for ears, as well as one facial piercing, is permissible. Hair jewelry, watches, bracelets, rings and necklaces that are not a safety hazard or a material or substantial disruption may be worn.</p>	<p>Jewelry that is considered gang-related is not allowed.</p> <p>Jewelry which is considered to be a safety hazard or a material or substantial disruption is not permitted.</p>
General	<p>Clothing must be neat and clean in appearance.</p> <p>For unique special events the campus administration may establish event-specific dress code requirements.</p>	<p>Hats, caps or hoods, sunglasses are not to be worn in the building except as specified by the administration.</p> <p>Scarves, bandanas, chains tied around legs, arms, waist, head, and or attached to pants.</p>

Campus administrators are authorized to determine the suitability of student attire and grooming.
